Homes and Care Needed for 50 Cats Removed from Cold Springs Home

Adoptions, Donations and Foster Care Needed to Help Save Cats

A Cold Springs homeowner surrendered 50 cats on August 26 and 27, 2009. Washoe County Regional Animal Services has removed the cats from the home and the cats are now under the care of Nevada Humane Society (NHS) is seeking loving homes for the cats and donations toward their care.

"The cats are in good shape and aside from a few that are a little fearful, they are very friendly kitties," said Denise Stevens, Operations Director for Nevada Humane Society. "The group includes two litters of adorable one-week-old kittens in need of foster care."

The cats are of various colors with beautiful markings. They will be available for adoption after being neutered, vaccinated, and microchipped over the next couple of days. The adoption fee for the adult cats is \$10.

"We are now in the second phase of kitten season, with kittens coming into the shelter at the rate of 20 on an average day. If you have ever considered adopting a cat or kitten, now is the time to do so. These beautiful cats all deserve loving homes," said Vonice Reed, Cat Care Manager for the Humane Society.

It costs Nevada Humane Society an average of \$240 to provide care to each animal who enters the shelter. To help cover the added expense of taking in these cats, NHS is requesting donations to help pay for additional care, food, and supplies. Donations of canned and dry cat and kitten food are also needed.

Feral cats are unsocialized cats who were born outside without a lot of human contact. While these kittles do not want to curl up on your lap, they still love life and want a place to call home. Once in an animal control shelter, most feral cats are put down because they would not make a good house pet. But you can adopt one or more cats to live outside on your property and save their lives!
