

See how being in a foster home is fun and life is easy, but being in a cage is sad and life is hard by trying to solve these mazes.






FOSTER MAZE (EASY)






SHELTER MAZE (HARD)


ALEX'S DOG TREAT RECIPE

INGREDIENTS:

1 Cup Flour (or ½ Cup Flour with ½ Cup Rolled Oats)

1/2 Cup Canned Pumpkin

1/3 Cup Peanut Butter



INSTRUCTIONS:

Mix ingredients together in a bowl using your hands and form into a big solid ball.

Makes one dozen treats.

Options for making treats:

- 1. For shaped treats: Roll dough out to $\frac{1}{2}$ inch thickness, then cut out shapes using a cookie cutter and place on an ungreased cookie sheet and bake at 350 degrees F for 10 to 15 minutes or until lightly brown on top.
- 2. For big dogs: Collect about a ½ inch ball-sized amount of dough. Using your hands, roll the dough into a ball, then smush down onto an ungreased cookie sheet using a spoon or a fork to about ¼ inch thickness. Bake at 350 degrees F for 15 minutes or until lightly brown on top.
- 3. For small dogs (or big dogs on a diet): Collect about a pea-sized amount of dough. Roll dough into a small ball using your hands, then smush down the ball with the tip of your finger to flatten in and place on an ungreased cookie sheet. Bake at 350 degrees F for 10 minutes or until lightly brown on top.

After the cookies are done baking, make sure the treats cool completely before sharing them with your dog.




Back at the Animal Resource Center,

INSTRUCTIONS:


- 1. Tie shoe lace around feather.
- 2. Play by waving in front of the cat


ADD ON - OPTION 1:

MATERIALS:


1 Old sock, with heel if possible 1 Tennis ball

INSTRUCTIONS:


- Tie a knot in the sock just below the heel.




Alex takes lots of fun pictures

Color in the photos so Wiggle and Waggle's family will recognize them.




WHAT SHOULD AN ID TAG SAY?

After reuniting with Wiggle and Waggle, their family bought ID tags and collars for them so they could be brought back home in case they ever got lost again.








